Report from Township Manager, Rich Hill

- Finished Crescent Drive drainage installed five (5) drain boxes and approximately 640 feet of pipe and a turnaround.
- Trimmed trees and brush on the entire length of Ipnar Road
- Mowed throughout the Township each work day.
- Cut fallen trees from storms.
- Working on road preparation for roads in paving and seal coating schedule.
- Performed camera work for roads involved with the Rillton Phase 1 Project. Contractor must complete the project by September 15, 2023
- Revamped the paving and seal coating from the roads originally listed. We freed up approximately \$77,000 in money so we can put some more roads in. We must adhere to state guidelines.
- Met with our Code Enforcement Officer. We've shortened the timeframe to five (5) days instead of ten (10). When a call comes in, we go out that day or the next to get a jump start on it.
- County Hauling will take one (1) large item per month free of charge.

Frank Sever Jr. asked how we are paying for the contracted road projects. Mr. Hill responded Liquid Fuels. Mr. Sever then spoke about 210 Hood Street, Hutchinson. He spoke with both the Land Bank and the Ordinance Officer. They have not heard from the Board of Supervisors regarding what will be done with this abandoned house. Kids are getting bit from rats and snakes. Mr. Hill responded he will be out tomorrow.

Report from Recreation Director, Chad Albert

Crabapple Park

- On August 4th, we received a letter from Comcast informing us of their plans to submit an application to PA's COVID-19 ARPA Capital Projects Fund Broadband Infrastructure Program to extend broadband service to unserved locations in Sewickley Township. Comcast has identified unserved homes in Sewickley Township (and adding Crabapple Park Wi-Fi)
- On August 11th, American Leak Detection ran a series of tests at Crabapple Pool to help determine sources of water loss. This has been an ongoing issue for several years that we are looking to address and fix as water utility expenses have risen significantly at that facility in the past few years. The situation will become worse if not addressed. We will use their report to explore solutions and estimate repair costs.

- Park Maintenance employees have been busy at the park repairing and resurfacing picnic tables, repairing damaged wood on the pavilion, brightening signs, fences and the gate with paint touchups. They are also working on replacing/repairing wood planks at the bleachers at Bruno Field.
- Park Maintenance and Road Department have made repairs at Hutchinson and Lowber Playgrounds over the last few months including tree removal, mulching, power-washing signs, memorials, walkways, and replacing weathered wood.
- We received shipment of the pickleball posts and nets that will complete the Crabapple Park Improvements Grant area at the ballfield. The pickleball court area is currently closed as installation is underway this week. Thank you to Rich and the Road department for their time and contributions to the park.
- Our volunteer Recreation Committee hosted Movie Night in the Park on Friday, July 28th selling concessions and showing the new Super Marios Brothers Movie for a crowd of approximately 75. Thank you to Heather Thoma of the Damsels in Distress organization for the donation of popcorn buckets. Thank you to Kerber's Dairy for the donation of orange drinks and Kona Ice Truck for attending.
- This Friday, August 18th, the Recreation Committee will host another Movie Night in the Park at 8:00pm. The new Minions: Rise of Gru movie will be playing. We invite all residents to bring blankets/chairs and enjoy a free outdoor Movie Night in the Park. The event takes place at Crabapple Park near the Large Pavilion.
- Herminie Business League will be hosting a Car Cruise on September 9th.

Report from Ordinance Officer, Bruce Zarnick

This month I have sent out 46 violation letters. These included multiple high grass and weeds complaints, several junk violations including junk vehicles, dangerous structure violations, encroachment of Township right-of-way on three (3) different streets, several parking complaints, multiple garbage and rubbish complaints, and two illegal burning complaints. Fourteen (14) citations were issued, nine (9) incidents were resolved and closed, and the rest are being reinvestigated to see if they are now in compliance or if citations need issued. I was in court on the 11th for an illegal burning violation. It did not go in favor of the Township this time. I am looking forward to the Ordinance updates coming soon so that we can better serve the community regarding some of these issues and more. I am also looking into some grant opportunities to help with Ordinance and public safety issues. I will provide more specifics on this at future meetings once I have more information on what we can apply for. I am going to have some messages from Code Enforcement placed on the website throughout the next few weeks. Please log on to see them and spread those messages to those who may not have internet access.

Report from Emergency Management Director, Michael Manley

Mrs. Harvey asked if Rillton VFC was invited to the Community Outreach. Mr. Manley stated it was put on by Hempfield Township and didn't have the answer.

Report from Gibson-Thomas Engineering --- given by Rich Hill

Rillton Stormwater Grant – We want to resubmit it to the County.

Crabapple Park – Installation of the net is not part of the grant, so the Road Crew is working on that.

Turner Valley – An email was sent to Gibson-Thomas Engineering regarding the \$500,000 grant awarded to the Township in March. They are continuing to work on a flood plain analysis for the project and will submit it with a small project joint permit application to the DEP as was directed by the DEP. They do not anticipate work starting on this project until the second half of next year.

Paving and Seal Coating - The contractor approved the change orders. We took off Reservoir Road and added Kalamazoo Road and also took off Orchard Road and added Falls Road. These will be milled and paved. By doing this, we freed up about \$77,000 that we'll be able to use for other road projects in the Township.

LSA Grant – We will be filling out paperwork next month for the LSA grant that goes through the State. We were awarded some pieces of equipment this year.

Several developer projects in process – EQT has some pad work. We're trying to get some information for the proposed Rutters Site in Waltz Mills. Rillton Dollar General, Mars Hills Storage and Sutersville Tower.

We're meeting on the 28th with the Conservation District regarding the road project on Stewart Lane. Also some work is being done on Waltz Mill Flats.

We have some road bonds, mostly related to gas wells and a few driveway permits.

Mrs. Harvey asked if there was a status update on the Recreation Center. Mr. Hill replied he has heard nothing from Gibson-Thomas or the Land Bank.

Westmoreland County Commissioner, Ted Kopas

Sewickley Township is a special place for me since I grew up in North Huntingdon and have spent many hours at Crabapple Pool and the Recreation Center. It's important for me to know who you are, what your needs are, and how the County can help satisfy that. My goal is to make this place better than when we left it and to help families and individuals when we can. I'm excited to hear about all the important things happening in Sewickley Township, and I'm confident we can help build off that progress. It's a point of pride to drive past Commerce Crossing. I'm proud that the Land Bank is now being used by residents and Township officials. We're tackling things that for years no one knew what to do with. In the last three (3) years, we invested more than \$630,000 into Sewickley Township through stormwater projects, ADA accommodations, etc. You have four (4) projects under agreement

with the Land Bank for properties. I'm looking forward to conversations about how we can advance the demolition of the Recreation Center since it's a public safety issue for the Township. I look forward to doing big things in Westmoreland County and Sewickley Township.

Commissioner Kopas took questions from the residents and provided answers to what he could.

Public Comment on Agenda Items Only

Nancy Bickus-Neel asked about the Eori subdivision motion. It mentions SSMSA. Does this plan tap into SSMSA sewage? If it is, her concerns are: 1) Did SSMSA vote on this and approve it? If it was, it was voted on with other Board members. 2) There's an Ordinance in 2006 that states that any new tap-ins that deal with the sewage authority must be approved by Elizabeth Township. Was this approved by Elizabeth Township? With this being a new taps-in, it needs to be approved by Elizabeth Township. 3) Pennsylvania American Water is looking into buying SSMSA. I don't want to violate a contract with PAW by having new customers being tapped in and they're not being made aware that this is being done. Unless these questions can be clarified, I would suggest you table this motion and make sure this is addressed.

Jason Capenos asked about the Weight Restriction Permit 2023-1 with Equitrans Water Services. Do we know more about what they're requesting? What type of traffic will be going through. Mr. Hill stated that he didn't know yet and would ask Gibson-Thomas Engineering. Mrs. Leukhardt added that the permit states construction for water lines.

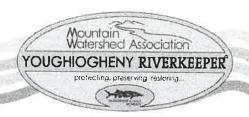

Sewickley Township: Westmoreland County Your Local Watershed Update: August 2023

- Joint Municipal Agreement to regulate potential impacts from MAX
 - MWA is continuing to evaluate potential avenues under the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act
- Signs: Working to post signage at MAX Outfall 001 and Fishing Access area to bring awareness to the hazardous waste outfall.
 - MWA has the equipment necessary to install the signs and is working with the private landowner for access.
 - MWA found that freestanding signs are not permitted in these locations per the zoning ordinance, so we will be pursuing actions to address that issue as well.
- Invenergy Power Plant ("Allegheny Energy Center")
 - The Allegheny County Health Department approved an air permit in 2021
 - o A number of groups appealed the issuance of the permit
 - o The appeal began on July 24, 2023 -- it is still ongoing
 - Attorneys, organizers, and involved community members will be starting a podcast on the issue in the coming months
- Swimmable Waters Sampling: MWA continues to conduct weekly water sampling at the Sewickley Canoe Launch for the presence of harmful E. Coli.
 - As of August 9th, the Sewickley Canoe Launch passed the swimmable waters requirements.
