Mr. Merdian led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Report from Roadmaster, Joe Kerber

The Crew was out for four days patching roads, finished brushing on Country Lane. The Crew was out two days on clean up after the storms that occurred at the beginning of the month. A bad wash out on McGrogan Road was repaired. We had some repair work on Morris Road and Route 136 from a truck that rolled over. This truck was hauling for Sunoco. The Supervisors called a meeting with Sunoco and they are going to pay us for the repairs. We are currently working on a large collapsed storm pipe on Wilps Drive. The pipe is installed and we have a lot of restoration work there.

Report from Ordinance Officer, Nick Newcaster

We have set out approximately twelve warning letters. Most of them have been for high grass or rubbish. An abandoned vehicle was removed out of the Herminie area. A private complaint was filed against a company that owns a residence in the Hermine area. That charge was for rubbish and debris and was filed before Magistrate Christner last week. There are three properties in the Herminie area scheduled for grass cutting. One is Mikes Bar. There are two properties in Hermine area that we are looking into seeing if we can get them to relinquish their rights to the property. A few complaints were answered about chickens in the Hutchinson area. As long as chickens are cooped there is not a whole lot I can do about it ordinance wise so I referred those questions to Mike Stack for Zoning. Margaret Sensue asked about the issues on Limerick Hill area. Ms. Sensue stated that there has been more junk brought into the area. He should have to be made to clear those out to an area that he is allowed to have these, not in a place where it's against the ordinance. Mr. Merdian stated we will continue to look into this. John Seanor has been fighting with a residence since last October about a pool that has turned green. Now that the weather is turning nicer we are starting to get mosquitos. They have junk cars in their yard. Now they have over ten people living in that house and the sewage is running out of the septic tank and it stinks. Bill did send a warning letter. Mr. Newcaster stated he is back in tomorrow and he will look into it.

Public Comment

Terry Stafford stated he is having a problem with sewage going through his property. Its causing a big hole and he is worried about someone falling into it. There is a second place along the edge of my property that it is eroding away and a third place that still has the old wooden pipe and it seems to be still flowing with sewage, you can smell it. Mr. Kerber stated that he has not done a one call yet, but as soon as he gets a problem on Wilps fixed where there is sewage backing up into someone's house done, he will be on to Mr. Stafford's issue. Mr. Merdian stated we obviously need to figure out what the sewage issue is also.

John Seanor asked if there is a plan on when we are going to start replacing the lights and hydrants, how much this will cost. Mr. Merdian stated that we will be looking into that the beginning of next year. We need to get a whole cycle of billing with the power company, see how much we saved by switching over to the LED lights. Based on this numbers we will then apply them to how many new fixtures we will be able to put up next year.

Connie Bosko stated that you received my written complaint about Seventh Street. It is now being torn up all the way from Madison Ave. all the way down. The asphalt is being stripped because of the storm water. It's been running like this, down Seventh Street for as long as we lived there. They put a curb in when I complained about it many years ago, when the water would come down and just sweep around the driveway, and then it would go out around and down the church building. It has now peeled back so much of that street, I now have a tenant that can't even get out of there to walk to the bus stop without salting that because he cants see where that huge chunk is out of the street. It washed down all the layers of asphalt, down now to dirt. It's now eight to ten inches deep. I can no longer move my car or drive my car there without fear of losing an axel. It is just becoming a nightmare. I want to know when you are going to get to it. Mr. Kerber stated that it is on the list, but it is on the bottom of the list. Ms. Bosko state that this was on the end of the list last year. Why am I now on the bottom again? Mr. Kerber stated he will put cold patch in the crater. Ms. Bosko stated that it is not going to stay. The water comes

down and just washes it out. The fireman had to come down when the storm drain got clogged up. It was a swimming pool down there, at least twice. Mr. Kerber stated that it is something that we have looked at. Ms. Bosko stated that for as much taxes as we pay in this township having no money is not acceptable anymore. I have been waiting for years. Ms. Bosco stated she would like to see a curb where your street ends and my property starts. So the water can go down the street and into the drain like everyone else's. It is going to start coming down the side of the building. If I start to have water damage in the church who is going to pay for that. Mr. Kerber stated he will be over to take a look at this.

Sandy Dull would like to ask Mr. Fossi a personal question. Mr. Fossi stated no. Mrs. Dull stated she will ask anyway, "When was the last time we had a personal conversation?" Mrs. Dull stated that the last time I had had a personal conversation with Mr. Fossi was over a year ago.
