

Chairman Alan Fossi on Wednesday, February 18, 2015 at 7:00pm in the Meeting Room of the Municipal Building called the Regular Meeting of the Sewickley Township Board of Supervisors to order as advertised in the Times-Sun on Thursday, January 1, 2015. The members of the Board of Supervisors present were Alan Fossi, Wanda Layman, and Joseph Kerber. Also attending the meeting were Kathy Kerber, Brad Tomko, Donald Layman, Brian Merdian, Jack McWilliams, Paul Rupnik, Tim Luft, Joe Napsha, Janet Schork, Mike Volpe, and Susan Leukhardt.

Mr. Fossi led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**An Executive Session was held before this meeting to discuss personnel matters.**

#### **Report from Public Works Director, Mike Volpe**

Snow removal call outs are at 19 since the last meeting with 23 year to date. Shoulder restoration was completed on Scott Haven Road. Falls Road Bridge deck was removed & storm pipe installed. With the road being closed for quite a while, the other cross pipes needed attention and trees were down. Hopefully we will have it opened after about another week of work. Monthly vehicle inspections & repairs were completed as required. A preliminary list of roads to be paved has been provided to the Board. Mr. Volpe has been in contact with the utility companies to make sure there isn't any conflict. He also provided to the Board an update on the mechanical troubles with bucket truck and the roller.

Mr. Kerber asked why he doesn't get a copy of his report. Susan Leukhardt stated that she will provide a copy to all the Supervisors.

#### **Report from Ordinance Officer, Dean Zimmerman (given by Susan Leukhardt)**

Since my last report in December, I have continued to work on junk motor vehicles in the Herminie, Hutchinson, and Rillton areas. I was finally able to get the owner of the burned out house on Limerick Road to board up the house for safety reasons. New complaints I received have consisted of a couple burning complaints and, of course, junk motor vehicles. Property maintenance is not much of an issue at this time of year. However, I want to again remind folks that when we get snow or icing conditions, they must make sure any vehicles they have parked on streets or roadways which may interfere with Township snow removal efforts are moved. If the vehicles are not moved in a timely manner, the Township has the authority to have the vehicles towed at the owner's expense.

We had a meeting on January 12<sup>th</sup> with April Kopas and Hallie Chatfield of the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Westmoreland to discuss various properties on the Land Bank list. The old Mike's Bar at 606 Sewickley Avenue and the green house at the corner of Sewickley Avenue and Pike Street are on the top of our list. The Land Bank is tracking those properties as they progress through the tax sale process. Hopefully those two properties will be able to be demolished and make Herminie look a little better. Also, I still have two properties on the County's Demolition Program list which I hope will be demolished this year.

I had one Summary Trial on December 18<sup>th</sup> for a repeat offender who was found guilty again and fined \$300.00 plus Court costs. That gentleman has appealed both convictions to Common Pleas Court and those hearings have not been scheduled yet. I have filed four new criminal complaints with the District Court since my last report. One is scheduled for a Summary Trial on April 7<sup>th</sup>, two have had arrest warrants issued for them, and the fourth one is still pending.

### Crabapple Pool

- Our 10% Holiday Special at Crabapple Park & Pool ended on February 1<sup>st</sup>.
  - We sold (6) Family Passes and (1) Senior Pass. \$1,354.50
  - We also had (3) pavilion rental reservations. \$337.50
  - Total 10% Holiday Discount = \$1,692.00

This will be a project organized by Nicholas Schork as part of his Eagle Scout requirements. Nicholas, Herminie Boy Scout Troop 259, Mr. Fossi and I will perform the work in Spring, 2015.

The Annual Convention of the Westmoreland County Association of Township Supervisors will be held on Friday, March 13, 2015 at Ferrante's Lakeview Restaurant, Route 30 East, Greensburg, PA. Section 1401 (b) and (c) (1), (2) and (3) of the Second Class Township Code states, "The supervisors, auditors, tax collectors, managers, solicitors, engineers, treasurer and secretary of the board of supervisors shall attend the conventions when possible. Each supervisor, auditor, tax collector, manager, solicitor, engineer, treasurer and secretary attending the convention shall receive a certificate, signed by the secretary of the county association, attesting their presence at the convention. The certificate entitles the official to collect from the township treasurer the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) for each day's attendance, expenses which are limited to the registration fee, mileage for use of a personal vehicle or reimbursement of actual transportation expense going to and returning from the meeting plus all other actual expenses that the board of supervisors agrees to pay. Every delegate attending the meeting shall submit to the board of supervisors an itemized account of expenses incurred at the meeting. If the meeting is held during township employee's normal work schedule, the board of supervisor may authorize township employees, including supervisors employed by the township, to be compensated at their regular employee rate during their attendance at the meeting, in which case the employee is not entitled to the fifty dollars (\$50) mentioned in this section. The board of supervisors may authorize a supervisor who is not employed by the township to receive total or partial reimbursement for lost wages or salary while attending the annual meeting, in which case the supervisor is not entitled to the fifty dollars (\$50) mentioned in this section, provided that sufficient documentation of such wages or salary is presented to the board of supervisors to justify the reimbursement."

Joe Kerber made a motion, seconded by Wanda Layman, to authorize those outlined in this Section of the Code, along with the Public Works Director, Office Manager, and Ordinance Officer to attend the Convention and that their expenses for travel, etc be paid by the Township and that Township employees be compensated at their regular employee rate and others receive the stipend as outlined in the Code.
